Interviews from the First Lady. As I said I want to meet all our members this year so I'm conducting computer interviews. My plan is to share them with you all! Lets get to know everyone!

Meet Boston (Thad) and Michele Elmore. This is what Boston had to say:

I started boating in the spring of 1975 out of Channel Island Harbor on a big old Post Sport fisherman going out with my grandfather. Michele came to boating in 2015.

Then, I moved on to racing class C sailboats on Lake Coeur d'Alene. I was out with a girlfriend at the old marina in 1982, talked to a guy about his boat, and crewed for three years. That included the Thanksgiving Day regattas and the New Year's Day buoy race(s); those were cold. Then, the Puget Sound for twenty-plus years of the best boating.

Our current boat is a Newport 28 MKii. We love this boat. She has been easy to care for and has all the creature comforts you need for a weekend on the hook or dock. She is by far the nimblest boat I have ever owned. She's easy to single-handle, and she's cute. Pura Vida sailed the San Juans for twenty years, then moved with us to Spokane for three before moving here to Rocky Point. The best anchorages must be Snoring Cove in the Sucia Islands and Indian Arm (Halkomelem) inland from Vancouver, BC, during the off-season.

Meet Katie Schenk. This is what Katie had to say:



I bought my first boat when I moved to my floating home in 2020. It was a 1979 19 ft bowrider with a 235 Johnson 2 stroke that smoked up the moorage each time I started it up. It was fun, but I was always a little scared to take it out by myself. As a kid, we had a bass boat and then later a pontoon boat that we used on the muddy lakes and rivers in Oklahoma.

I bought my 2003 31 ft Camano Troll in 2022. She is hull #199 of approximately 270 that were built outside of Vancouver BC. She has a 200hp Volvo Penta and a beloved bow thruster. It has been so fun to learn how to single hand and I think it's the perfect size for managing it on my own. That being said, she can sleep three people comfortably.

The list is long. I love the salon layout and down galley. I feel like there is room for multiple people to hang out and move around. The semi-displacement hull lets me throttle up to 15kts if I need to but she's super fuel efficient around the 1800RPM / 7 knots mark.

It took me some time to build up the nerve to anchor out by myself and I'm still fairly new to it. I spent 5 days anchored off Tongue Point last summer and loved it. I could enjoy watching the river traffic but not be bothered by wake or wind.

Meet Rob and Julie Davison. This is what Rob had to say:



Julie and I have been boating for nearly 40 years but we purchased our current boat 10 years ago; it's our first "big" boat. We also have a 19' aluminum boat that we keep at the coast for fishing.

Here is a photo from one of our favorite anchorages in Desolation Sound.

Our boat is a 34' American Tug named Nekas, which is a native American word for Salmon. (The original name of the Salmon River on the Oregon coast was the Nekas River). Nekas is a single screw diesel powered boat that we

purchased to explore Puget Sound and points North. While we enjoy boating with our NOTS friends on the Columbia we long for British Columbia; so far we have only taken one extended trip North. In 2015 we spent two months going as far north as Desolation Sound and hope to do that again when we can.

Nekas is perfect for a couple; she is a stout boat that is built on a hull designed for Alaskan salmon fishing so we feel very comfortable and safe with her. Our favorite anchorage on the Columbia is Martin Slough, but up north we loved Princess Louisa Inlet and Von Donop Marine Provincial Park. It's hard to pick a favorite up north.

I enjoyed reading through these responses. I feel I often do not do a good job of visiting on the dock. I'm more invested now in getting to know you all better. FM Leslie
